 - Train Wreck Park (2) Budget overrun on first grant of \$1,359. Initial grant submission was assuming cost of site work/engineering and additional site work and engineering services were needed; T. Penn-Gesek is proposing Trails Committee pay and possibly EDC
 - CIF Grant \$3.88 Million Thompson was not a recipient of funds; T. Penn-Gesek has scheduled a
 phone call to get feedback; she will review the executive summary and apply again

- Kubota Foundation partnering with Eastern Connecticut Conservation District (ECCD) to prepare application for additional 65 Main funding; specific area of the plan has been identified; submitted by mid-April; finalists chosen by end of June; Opened up for public voting – 20 awards (10 regions – 1st place \$50,000 and 2nd place \$10,000)
- Center for Community Progress reaching out to TEEG to discuss partnership on application/ project for additional 65 Main funding; creative space project; 3 municipalities will be awarded \$10,000/each; T. Penn-Gesek will be attending a webinar to learn more
